Recycling on the west side of town will be picked up bi-weekly on Tuesdays from the Black Horse Pike over.

Recycling on the east side of town will be picked up bi-weekly on Thursdays from the Black Horse Pike over.

Please do not mix trash with recyclables, it will not be picked up.

Please do not bring batteries to the Borough Hall or the Borough Garage any longer for disposal. Alkaline batteries no longer contain mercury and are not picked up by the county. These alkaline batteries should be placed in your regular trash. Any other types of batteries should be dropped off at Radio Shack or Home Depot for proper disposal.

**YARD WASTE COLLECTION SCHEDULE 2009**

Yard waste collection will begin on Friday, 4/3/09 and will continue every Friday thereafter. Yard waste includes flowers, plants, vegetation and small bushes.

The borough prefers you put your yard waste in trash cans, marked **YARD WASTE**. Branches and brush must be cut into 3 foot lengths and tied in bundles no heavier than 50 lbs. Please call the borough garage at 939-4320 if you have any yard waste to be picked up. **Do not place grass clippings in with yard waste.**

**GRASS CLIPPING COLLECTION SCHEDULE 2009**

Grass clipping collection will begin on Monday, 4/6/09 and will continue every Monday thereafter.

The borough prefers you put your grass clippings in trash cans, marked **GRASS**. Please do not put any other trash in with the grass clippings such as dirt, leaves or sticks. Please call the borough garage at 939-4320 if you have any grass clippings to be picked up. **Do not place yard waste in with grass clippings.**

Use newspaper, bags or pooper-scoopers to pick up waste;  
Dispose of the wrapped pet waste in the trash or unwrapped in a toilet;  
Never discard pet waste in a storm drain.

### **Don't Feed Wildlife**

Do not feed wildlife, such as ducks and geese, in public areas;  
Many municipalities and other public agencies must enact an enforce a rule that prohibits wildlife feeding in these areas.

### **Don't Litter**

Place litter in trash receptacles;  
Recycle, Recycle, Recycle;  
Participate in community cleanups.

### **Dispose of Yard Waste Properly**

Keep leaves and grass out of storm drains;  
If your municipality or agency has yard waste collection rules, follow them;  
Use leaves and grass clippings as a resource for compost;  
Use a mulching mower that recycles grass clippings into the lawn.
